CHARTER MEMBER

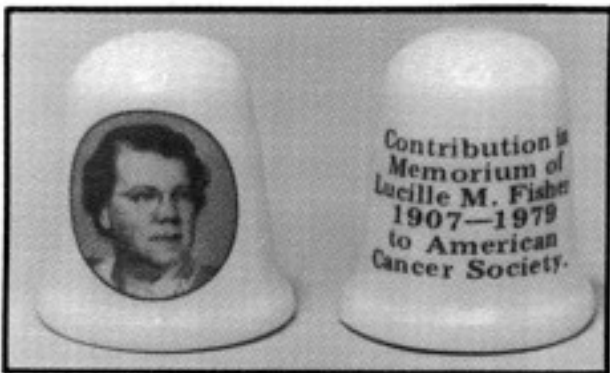
She was born Lucille M. Hoyle on October 3, 1907 in Iron Mountain, Michigan, and she graduated from Iron Mountain High School in 1926. Lucille attended South Dakota State University where she majored in music and art. She also attended Michigan University and received a degree in early elementary education.

Lucille was a well-known retired teacher and the wife of Conan E. Fisher. Mrs. Fisher taught music and art for three years at Iron River and directed a prize-winning band there. She taught second grade for a year at Kipling, five years at Perkins, five years at Wells and fourteen years in Gladstone for a total of twenty-eight years until her retirement in 1970.

She was a member of the Memorial United Methodist Church and sang in the church choir. She was a soprano soloist for many of the special choral presentations in the area, including "The Messiah." She was also a member and past worthy matron of the Minnewasca Chapter No. 396, Order of the Eastern Star.

Lucille was survived by her husband, Conan; a son Conan E. Fisher Jr. and a daughter, Mrs. James Featherston.

The **Collectors Circle Gazette** established the Lucille M. Fisher Cancer Fund in 1980 in memory of their Charter Member, Lucille M. Fisher. The Collectors Circle Gazette was established in 1976. A collector thimble was made of white porcelain depicting an actual black and white photo decal of the late Mrs. Fisher. It was imprinted on the reverse with: "Contribution in Memorium of Lucille M. Fisher 1907-1979 to American Cancer Society." The cost of the thimble was \$4 plus postage. Funds from the sale of this thimble, went to the American Cancer Society.
